

CONDITIONS OF BOOKING

- A booking is only secured when a deposit and booking form are received and acknowledged by us.
- If you cancel your booking, the deposit is forfeited.
- The balance of fees must be paid four weeks before the start of a course.
- If you cancel your booking less than 12 weeks before the start of the course, 60% of full fees are due; if less than two weeks, then full fees are due.
- Should you have a change in circumstances, do contact the Fellowship Afloat office immediately; we will do all we can to accommodate your needs.
- Anyone participating in water activities must be fit for the activity and confident in water wearing a buoyancy aid (supplied at no extra cost by Fellowship Afloat).
- Fellowship Afloat is covered by public liability insurance which indemnifies the Trust in the event of accident or loss resulting from negligence on its part. Personal accident and property loss for visitors is not covered, so we advise you to make your own arrangements if insurance is required.

Living Landscape

Fellowship Afloat's centre at Tollesbury, Essex, is a unique place for adventure, relaxation and exploring the environment. The combination of sea, sky and saltmarsh adds up to a very particular kind of beauty. Fellowship Afloat is based on board a converted Trinity House Lightvessel. *Trinity* is fitted out with centrally heated cabins, modern showers and toilets, well-equipped galley and saloon enjoying panoramic views of the saltings and estuary.

The programme will include:

- Demonstrations from Tony Osler that will hold you spellbound and give you easy to copy techniques to practice.
- Painting and sketching from the panoramic comfort of *Trinity's* saloon and as weather allows an opportunity to find a quiet spot amongst the saltmarsh and historic boatyard buildings.
- Enjoying the unique vantage of sketching from the Trust's motor launch *Sanderling* in the creeks and fleets of the estuary, (weather permitting).
- Informative exercises on many aspects of producing watercolour paintings with a maritime flavour.

Tutor for the course - Tony Osler

Tony is a professional marine artist who has enjoyed a long association with Fellowship Afloat, bringing groups of youngsters down to Tollesbury as long ago as 1976. He has been painting the seas, skies and boats of the East Coast for over 40 years and has had many one man shows of his paintings, including one in Paris. Tony exhibits at galleries in East Anglia, Kent, the Isle of Wight and Dorset and specialises in the traditional craft of the East Coast.

What to bring:

- A wooden drawing board
- Good quality watercolour paper, at least 90lb weight - 140lb is much better
- A small sketch-book
- 2B + 6B pencils, eraser
- A water container
- Brown paper sticky tape (not masking tape)
- A selection of brushes - a 1" Hake for covering large areas with water or paint - a No 5 round and a No 1 for fine detail
- A craft knife
- A hairdryer if you have one
- Watercolours (buy the very best you can afford, preferably 'Artists' quality)

Light Red	Windsor Yellow
Cadmium Red	Antwerp Blue
Alizarin Crimson	Ultramarine Blue
Neutral tint	Oxide of Chromium
Paynes Grey	(sometimes called
Raw Sienna	Chrome Green)

These are the colours that the tutor most uses - many people accumulate their own favourites over the years. If your kit is totally different to that given above, no matter, bring it along just the same! - we all learn from each other. The tutor will bring some good quality paper for sale and a selection of art books for study and enjoyment during the weekend. Weather permitting there will be a boat trip to gather material and soak up the atmosphere.
