Our Residential Centre

Trinity, our floating base has accommodation for 36 people in 2, 4 and 5 berth cabins. Moored on the East Coast it is the ideal activity venue for individuals, youth clubs, schools, churches, people with special needs and those wishing to gain RYA qualifications.

Bursary Fund

Fellowship Afloat is committed to serving people whose financial means are limited. Our Bursary Fund is an easy and available way to enable those people to enjoy a residential course onboard. Do ask the office for details, which includes completion of a simple application form.

Arrival & Welcome

On arrival, we will meet you in our car park and assist you with your luggage for the five minute walk to *Trinity*; please 'phone 01621 868113 (office) or 01621 869779 (centre) as you arrive in the village. After settling everyone in, we will have introductions and talk through the rules of the centre and safety aspects.

Fellowship Afloat Staff & Responsibilities

During your stay, you will be looked after by both permanent and seasonal volunteers, all of whom are trained and familiar with life on board and the various specialist activities. Appropriate personal checks, which include a DBS Disclosure, are made on all new staff.

Fellowship Afloat staff take full responsibility for the organisation of domestic arrangements and activities.

The highest priority is given to the safety and comfort of visitors.

Life On *Trinity*

The experience of living together in a community is one of the most important aspects of your stay on board. Guests always enjoy sharing and doing things together - helping with the washing-up and cleaning is as much a part of your stay as the activities. As Christians we welcome the opportunity of sharing our faith; feel free to join us in the Christian life of the centre.

Practical Matters

For the time spent on the water - be prepared with plenty of warm clothing - the kit list below will give you some idea of what to bring.

Protection against the sun when you are on the water is important: sunglasses are recommended, sun cream is essential. Footwear requires thought too - you'll need one pair of outside shoes and wellies if possible (we have some spare wellies onboard catering for most sizes up to 8) and trainers or light shoes onboard.

If you don't own a sleeping bag - don't worry - we have spares that can be hired at £3 for a weekend or £5 for a week. Foam pillows and pillowcases are provided for each individual.

Waterproofs and buoyancy aids are available for all

Suggested kit list (Bring in a soft bag)

- Sleeping bag
- 2 towels
- Warm jacket
- Indoor and outdoor shoes
- Warm jumpers /sweatershirt
- Hat/scarf/gloves (for cold weather)
- At least one complete change of clothes
- Wash kit
- Nightwear
- Wellies

For water-based activities

- Soft-soled shoes e.g.trainers
- Tracksuit trousers or leggings (NOT jeans)
- Plenty of warm layers
- A woolly hat or cap / gloves
- Sun cream

Personal Belongings & Pocket Money

We discourage the use of mobile phones, MP3 players and iPods etc onboard: apart from the obvious distraction, they can get lost or broken.

We have a small souvenir shop on board, items starting from 30p. We also have *Trinity* garments: T-shirts, baseball caps and sweaters, these range from £6.00 - £25.00 for a sweater.

Sweets and drinks can be purchased in the village.

INDIVIDUAL BOOKING INFO (CONTINUED)

Conditions of booking

- A booking is only secured when a deposit and booking form are received and acknowledged by us.
- If you cancel your booking, for what ever reason, the deposit is forfeited.
- The balance of fees must be paid six weeks before the start of a course.
- If you cancel your booking, for whatever reason, less than 12 weeks before the start of a course 60% of the full fees are due; if less than six weeks the full fees are due.
- If a booking has to be cancelled by the centre, and no acceptable alternative dates are available, all fees paid to the centre will be refunded.
- Should you have a change in circumstances, do contact the FACT office immediately; we will do all we can to accommodate your needs.
- Anyone participating in water activities must be fit for the activity and confident in the water wearing a buoyancy aid (supplied at no extra cost by FACT)
- Fellowship Afloat is covered by public liability insurance which indemnifies the Trust in the event of an accident or loss resulting from negligence on its part.
- Cancellation costs, personal accident and property loss for visitors is not covered, so we advise you to make your own arrangements if insurance is required.
- Visitors are advised that they are not permitted to publish or make available to the public, images in any format, whether static or moving of the staff or volunteers of the Trust; or any organised activities, unless express permission has been granted in writing.
