Just three words:


<u>Best choice ever</u>

I grew in confidence in relating to different people and how to lead different activities with them, whether formally, like sailing, or informally, like cleaning up together. I think it has also shaped me in how I lead, teach and communicate.

In April, works begin to refurbish the light tower, including glazing to fully enclose it. By June, the extended lookout is completed and in use.



2018

October - the light tower refurbishment is complete. Phase 3 begins! The new floor level is set in the engine room, the old toilets & showers are demolished, install of new heating & hot water system begins.





2019

January - the helical staircase arrives in three pieces and is welded into place. The ground source heat pump is commissioned. The relocated toilets and showers are installed.



9 2019

February - the ship reopens to groups after the most complex phase. The upper saloon is complete and immediately in use.



10 2019

November - Phase 4 gets underway! Construction on the accessible cabins and relocated shop begins with structural works.

Bursary Fund

Our Bursary Fund continues to make a real difference to so many groups and individuals each year – this fund exists to make sure that "no one is left behind" and to support those who want to visit but have limited means to do so.

In 2023, we experienced high demand amid the cost of living crisis, dispersing almost £19,000 of support so nearly 200 young people could have life-changing moments onboard, experiencing adventure and challenge in a caring waterside community.

Here are some comments from some of those who benefited last year:

"We have received many acts of kindness since arriving in the UK, but none as kind as the bursary that meant that our son could attend. It has helped us both. His teachers say he is more confident and his English has improved. He was so happy when I picked him up, and continues to ask to return. Thank you very much for organising the bursary, it is for me, unbelievably kind."

"Our son liked the boat trip and the night walk, he also liked the food and he is a fussy eater. He came back and said it was the best time ever and he was so happy that he went and tried new things."

"Our daughter enjoyed the high ropes, kayaking, speedboats and sailing. She would never have had the choice to do these without the bursary."

June - works restart with steel works for the ensuite cabins. Ventilation routes, underfloor heating, spray foam insulation all installed. Sprinkler system first fix.



Phase 4 concludes with the completion of all six ensuite cabins & volunteer changing space. Sprinkler system extended into original cabins in staff area.

Activity Updates

Our new RIB was delayed and so we look forward to a new addition to the fleet arriving in the spring. This larger vessel will support our RYA powerboat training and safety boat fleet, in use throughout the season. Last year we were pleased to be able to replace both RIB engines and our single-hander fleet of Fusions, which ensures reliable and well-equipped boats.

We are also pleased to have been able to replace all our high ropes PPE (e.g. helmets & harnesses) after ten years of service.

These new foundations have enabled our new accessible entrance as part of our final stage of Trinity3. She looks fabulous!




